## End of school year can be stressful

Your teen has a test tomorrow. Her history paper is due next week. The math teacher just assigned a group project. And she has a summer job interview this weekend. No wonder she's stressed!

The end of a school year is often a time when students feel overwhelmed by all they have to do. And, since stressed teens are rarely at their best, that can lead them to perform poorly and below their capabilities.

The good news is that there are ways parents can help teens deal with the stress of this time of the year. You can:

- Listen to her. Sometimes, just giving your teen a chance to let off steam
can be a help. Don't try to "fix" her problem. Just let her talk and really listen to her.
- Encourage her to find solutions. Ask her questions to help her figure out a way to work through the problem. Could she create a study schedule? Is it possible to reschedule her interview? She's more likely to stick with a solution if she's the one who developed it.
- Teach her some helpful stress relievers. Taking a few deep breaths before an exam or a job interview can make her feel more in control. A brief walk outside can help her regain her focus. Eating a healthy snack will give her energy

## Baseball team starts 11-1, undefeated in league play

The St. Mary's Varsity Baseball Team has started the 2013 season very strong, presently being undefeated (5-0) in league play with an 11-1 record overall.

After starting the season with nonleague wins against Newfane and their four opponents during the Myrtle Beach trip during Easter Break, the Lancers recorded their only loss, falling to Lancaster, 3-1.

Once they started league play, they have been unstoppable with wins over Timon (17-1 and 4-3), St. Francis (8-5), Canisius (7-2), Nichols (8-6), and St. Joe's (1-0).

Senior Chris Kwitzer is leading the Lancers in nearly all offensive categories, including hits, runs-batted-in, batting average, slugging percentage, and onbase percentage.

On the mound, senior Lucas Schaefer

has a 6 and 1 record, with 28 strike outs while having a 1.28 earned run average. Senior Brian Dudek is two-for-two in save opportunities, while anchoring the Lancer defense at shortstop.

The Lancers' season will continue with a rematch against St. Joe's, make-up games versus St. Francis, Canisius, and Nichols, and a home-and-home against Cardinal O'Hara.

They also have non-league contests against Williamsville North and Frewsburg and a make-up against West Seneca East. League Playoffs will begin on May 21.
