STEAM Program wins STEM Award

In October 2016, the St. Mary's High School STEAM Program was recognized by WNY STEM as a School on the Move at a reception held at the Roswell Park Cancer Institute. Over the past four years, through a generous grant from the John R. Oishei Foundation, St. Mary's has created a comprehensive program to develop student interest in STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and math) fields.

Currently every sophomore must complete at least two STEAM challenges, such as competitions in bridge building, bottle rocket construction and making a mousetrap-powered vehicle. Additionally, juniors and seniors are involved in a large-scale project, constructing a greenhouse with recycled 2-liter bottles.

Next year the program will be expanding with the creation of a "trout room". Students will be raising trout from eggs, to be released into area rivers and streams to help repopulate this important species vital to our local aquatic ecosystems.

Kids Escaping Drugs Leadership Conference

Members of Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD) Club attended the Kids Escaping Drugs Summit. St. Mary's students raised over \$600 on a Jeans Day to be donated to Kids Escaping Drugs. We discussed the danger of using drugs and how addiction affects people. We learned about stereotypes associated with addiction and had a chance to hear stories of addiction and recovery from KEDS alumni. We discussed a few celebrities and athletes who have dealt with addiction along with messages from the media and how they impact students.

Dale Carlson '63

has joined the full-time faculty of Quinnipiac University School of Law in North Haven, CT as a "distinguished practitioner-in-residence". He directs the intellectual property law concentration at the school, and teaches courses in patent law and advanced patent law. Dale is a retired partner at Wiggan and Dana (New Haven, CT), and a past president of the New York Intellectual Property Law Association, the largest regional IP law association in the United States.

After graduating from St. Mary's, Dale went on to achieve both a B.S. in Chemical Engineering and a M.B.A. from the State University at Buffalo; and then a J.D. from Syracuse University Law.

Officer Nazzarett has been a member of the Cheektowaga Police Department for the past 17 years, 12 of which have been spent with the Community Crime Prevention Unit. He is a member of the Cheektowaga Steering Committee with the mobile Safety Net team, an initiative of the Oishei Foundation that seeks to strengthen the region's safety net

through identifying barriers of access to essential human needs.

Paul is also a CHOICES Program mentor working with the Cheektowaga Chamber of Commerce. CHOICES is an interactive, decision-making workshop that encourages middle school students to stay in school, as the choices they make today impact their futures.

Of all his accomplishments, Paul's personal favorite is the Cheektowaga Police Department's "Do the Right Thing Program". It is open to all students in grades kindergarten through 12th who reside, attend school or do a recognizable deed in Cheektowaga. Nominated students are honored at an annual ceremony for making a difference in their hometown.



Don Nichter '75

was inducted into the South Central Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in November, 2016.

In the three decades since joining Dickinson College's staff, Nichter has become the most decorated coach in modern history. His cross country, and now track teams, have combined for 16 conference championships in the highly-competitive Centennial

conference, and his women's cross country program is currently working on a string of 16 straight team appearances at the NCAA Division III championships. The men are equally successful and saw an eight-year streak of NCAA team appearances end in 2015.

Nichter—a seven-time Mid-East Coach of the Year as selected by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Association—has contributed to the development of 34 All-Americans, and has produced two national track champions.

Nichter ran cross country at St. Mary's and later helped petition Ithaca College to start a cross country program (he ran on its first team in his senior year).
