St. Mary's High School is excited to, once again, offer an SAT Prep course to our students. The course will cover both verbal and math skills and help students to navigate the intricacies of the SAT exam given by the College Board. The course offered will serve either the March 11th or the May 6th exams.

The course is \$90 (Review book included)

Payments can be made by cash, check, or charge. The course will run 4 days a week for 3 consecutive Session II weeks.

* Note: Registration for the SAT exam itself is done separately through the College Board website. St. Mary's cannot register individual students for the exam!

Clearing Up the Dress Code By: The Journalism Jams

The Journalism Academy interviewed Mrs. Junik regarding the Dress Code. Some people have been confused about the specific details of the Dress Code, and we have answered the current questions that everyone has been asking.

On regular Dress Code days, Mrs. Junik says that we can have school-colored quarter zips or neutral-colored ones. They should be an appropriate length with no big logos. In addition, Lululemon scubas with a hood are not permitted. Crewnecks are also allowed as long as they are school colors and have no big logos. Students should also wear a collared shirt underneath. Absolutely no hoodies are permitted. Regarding skirts, no Lululemon skirts or white skirts should be worn. They should be navy, khaki, or plaid. During professional dress up days, Mrs. Junik wants to reinforce the length of the skirts. Students need to make sure that their skirts are an appropriate length. We hope this information helps clear things up!
